### **Eligibility for Society Membership (from The Society's Constitution)**

*'Membership is intended to be inclusive but specialist. Membership is open to Consultant Pathologists, or equivalent, specialising in, or developing a specialist interest in, Endocrine Histopathology including related Cytopathology. Cytopathologists with an interest in Endocrine Pathology are eligible to join, but the main educational thrust of the Society is in Histopathology.*

*Advanced trainee Histopathologists considering sub-specialising in Endocrine Histopathology (usually in the peri-Part 2 FRCPATH/CCT phase of their career) will be welcomed as guests without charge for a period of up to two years. Scientists interested in endocrine research may join without participating in slide circulations.*

*The Society will have two categories of membership; Ordinary membership and Overseas membership (for Ordinary members who have moved abroad subsequently). A non-refundable joining fee will be payable by each new member, the amount to be confirmed regularly at the business meeting. This may be replaced by an annual membership fee in future should liabilities require.'*
